#### **OBSERVANCE OF MEMORIAL DAY**

By the authority vested in me as President of the Department of California and Pacific, by the Department Bylaws, and the National Constitution, Rules and Regulations, it is hereby ordered as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: General Order No. 11, issued in 1868 by Gen. John A. Logan, Commander-in-Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, called for a day to be set aside "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country" and to "arrange such fitting services and testimonials of respect as circumstances may permit." This day is now known as Memorial Day.

<u>Section 2</u>: Our obligation as Sisters of the ASUVCW is to keep and observe Memorial Day. Every Auxiliary should participate in at least one Memorial Day event. As few frateranal organizations have ever created a national holiday, it is truly our duly to carry this on, and keep green the memory of the Boys in Blue.

<u>Section 3</u>: Auxiliary Sisters are hereby encouraged to observe Memorial Day by participating in or establishing appropriate events in their local communities.

<u>Section 6</u>: All Department Sisters are respectfully directed to attach a black mourning ribbon to their membership badge for a period of thirty (30) days.

<u>Section 7</u>: The Department of California and Pacific extends its sincere condolences to the LGAR and family of Sister Nelson.
