

Camp 17 Brothers,



Minutes of meeting of 5-15-14 submitted; motion by George Dore to approve, second by Marcus Deemer; motion carried.

Treasurer report - by Glen Roosevelt from data provided by Terry Shaw: balance at 9/18/2014 was \$2,766.06, income for May-August was \$147.00 (\$90.00 for dues and \$57.00 for May raffle proceeds) and expenses totaled \$254.30 (\$50.00 ad for National, 62.50 for wreath, 50.00 for HB booth, 40 for hall rent, and 2.80 for postage) for net loss of \$107.30. YTD income was \$1,567.00 and expense was \$1,259.30 for YTD net income of \$307.70. Motion by Greg Lutes to approve, second by George Dore, motion carried.

Harry Brown - He Got Around

Introduction by Terry Shaw

Harry Brown, on my mother's side, is one of two documented great-great grandfathers of mine who served in the Union Army during the Civil War, the other one being Chancy (various spellings) Coburn Shaw who served in Co. A of the 5th Maine Infantry. The following narrative is an excerpt from "The History of Olmsted County Minnesota" written by the Hon. Joseph A. Leonard and published by Goodspeed Historical Association in 1910:

HARRY BROWN, who passed away on July 4, 1875, and now lies at rest in the cemetery at Chatfield, was born in St. Lawrence county, New York, June 18, 1825, and was of English extraction. Early in life he removed to Michigan and from there went to Illinois, where he was married. He and wife then moved to Winnebago county, Wisconsin. When gold was discovered in California, Mr. Brown crossed the plains by ox team, the trip occupying a period of three months, and for three years cast his lot with the fortune seekers whose struggles for wealth have since become a matter of history. He then returned East and joined his family in Iowa, where they had removed during his absence. Shortly thereafter the family came to Minnesota and settled on a farm near Albert Lea, one mile north of Bear Lake, remaining here until 1859. Mr. Brown then disposed of his farm and settled on a tract in Fillmore county, this state, about six miles west of Chatfield, where he farmed successfully for two years. In the spring of 1861 he went to Colorado, but in the fall of the same year returned home and resumed farming. In 1862 he enlisted with the "Boys in Blue" for the preservation of the Union, joining Company H, Sixth Minnesota Volunteer Infantry, and after a three years' service was honorably discharged by the War Department of the United States Government. He then returned home and followed farming until his death. To him and wife a family of five children were born, named Leosa, Warren H., Emma, Hannah and Carrie, and of these Emma, Carrie and Warren are yet living.

Postscript: Harry's wife, who for some unknown reason was not named in the bio, was Mary Ann Smalley, born in 1828 and died on Jan. 12, 1903. Mary Ann was also my mother's name. Harry's health suffered from his Civil War service and after a long drawn out process, Mary Ann received a widow's pension based on his service.

Interestingly, there seem to be discrepancies between his actual age and those on his service record, where his given age is younger. Did he lie about his age for some reason? Perhaps...

Harry's son Warren was my great grandfather and eventually became a hotelier, owning the Brown's Hotel in Rochester, MN. There is a bio on him in the publication as well, but that's another story for another time.

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the Department of the California and Pacific. By the Department of California and Pacific, of the "Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War". Declare the establishment of:

Section 1.) A Multi-Camp "Installation of Officers" <u>Ceremony will take place at 12 NOON</u>, <u>Saturday</u>, on <u>JANUARY 17TH</u>, <u>2015</u>, <u>AT the Patriotic Hall</u>, <u>at 1816 South</u>
<u>Figueroa</u>, <u>Los Angeles</u>, <u>California</u>. The Place, Date, and time established & scheduled by Camp Rosecrans #2 of Los Angeles, California by Camp Commander: Nicholas D. Smith, and Concurred by Department Councilman: Rudy Velasco III of Stoneman, Jr. Camp 18 of the Inland Empire, California.

Section 2.) Department Commander: Tim P. Reese will be present on that day to Install officers from any Camp who wishes to attend and be installed to the Camp he represents.

Section 3.) Camps are still free to hold their own isolated Camp Installation of Officers ceremonies, as so long there is a designated qualified installing officer authorized by the Department Commander.

Section 4.) Camp Secretaries, please don't forget to bring Form 22's to be signed by the Department Commander, and to acknowledge the installment of your camps officers.
