

Camp 17 Election for 2017 Officers Held November 17 – Installation on Jan. 19

The 2017 officers for Camp 17 were essentially elected (without official quorum) at the November 17, 2016 meeting. The nominations for 2017 elected offices were; Greg "Doc" Lutes as Commander, George Dore as SVC, Cole Zehnder as JVC, and Terry Shaw as Secretary-Treasurer. The Camp Council was nominated as made up of Charles Beal, Dan Henry, and another member to be elected to replace Joe Hart.

We will also observe the Camp's 14th Anniversary with our traditional birthday cake and other refreshments.

Camp 17 Brothers from the Orange County Chapter SAR participated in the Annual Wreaths Across America wreath laying ceremony on Saturday, December 17th at the Brea Memorial Gardens Cemetery. The SAR and Camp 17 members laid wreaths at the foot of the Veterans Monument at 9 am PST. Hundreds of ceremonies were occurring simultaneously across the country. The California Society SAR Lee's Legion Color Guard, led by former Camp 17 Brother Jim Fosdyck presented the colors, and also sponsored a wreath. The ceremony included presenting the colors, invocation, Pledge of Allegiance, "God Bless America" sung by Camp 17 Brother Jim Blauer. Wreaths were also presented by Camp 17 Past Commander Charles Beal on behalf of the Camp and DUVCW Tent 88 was also represented. Camp 17 Past Commander Dan Henry participated in the SAR Color Guard. The guest speaker was State Senator of California 29th District, Honorable Josh Newman. A Saber Arch under the direction of Lt. Col. Hans F. Hunt was conducted by a detachment of the Sonora High School Army JROTC cadets who acted as Honor Guard. Sponsors and volunteers placed some 450 wreaths on the graves of veterans.



Where in The World is Camp 17 PCC Joe Hart?

As reported in the last newsletter, PCC Joe Hart has relocated to Alexandria, Virginia to keep guard on the Capitol. He has been out in the field regularly visiting Civil War battle sites and other places of historical interest. Since our last edition, Joe has revisited the Manassas battlefield, and kindly remembered PCCs Dan Henry and Glen Roosevelt with a stop at the U.S. Marine Battalion marker on Henry Hill ... Semper Fi! He also made a stop near the birthplace of Marine Lt. Presley Neville O'Bannon, the hero of the 1805 Battle of Derne, Tripoli ... Ooorah! Back on the Civil War trail he stopped at Delaplane, Virginia where he had actually contemplated purchasing an early 1800's home of 3,000 plus square feet on an acre-plus property that faced on the railroad tracks that Stonewall Jackson used to rush his troops to the First Battle of Manassas (Bull Run) in July 1861. Despite the under \$400k price and his own ice house on the property, the daily trains in the front yard were too much to put up with. If only Joe had been there to intercept Stonewall!









PCC Charles Beal Helps Acquire Old Santa Ana Camp 12 Artifacts

PCC Charles Beal with an ever-watchful eye on e-Bay spotted some old SUVCW Santa Ana Camp 12 artifacts up for auction in late-June 2016. He alerted PDC Glen Roosevelt, and the two agreed to pursue and acquire the artifacts if possible. Camp 12 had existed in Santa Ana from the 1920s until about 1968 when the last "Real Son" Roy Kelchner passed on. Camp 17 had previously acquired a large group of Camp 12 records and artifacts from Roy's son Don Kelchner in 2003. Beal was successful in submitting a winning bid funded by him and Roosevelt, and the artifacts were picked up from an Orange antique dealer on June 28, 2016. The artifacts included a Camp 12 banner which was fashioned from a defunct Santa Barbara Camp 33 banner, Minutes and Accounts ledgers from Camp 12, rosters and minutes from old Santa Cruz Wallace – Reynolds Camp 5, minutes and rosters from old Santa Rosa Redwood Empire Camp 25, and several records and artifacts from the old Department Past Commanders Club. The records were packed into a custom made wooden box that was apparently kept by the then Department Secretary (circa 1968). The Orange antique dealer had purchased these items from two different dealers at the Long Beach swap meet. Additionally, PDC Roosevelt noticed and purchased a 1911 edition of Orange County History – Illustrated from the dealer; and the book contains a photo-engraving and biography of Camp 17's Secretary – Treasurer Terry Shaw's prominent Santa Ana ancestor Linn L. Shaw, a son of Terry's Civil War ancestor Chauncey Shaw.

Treasurer report - by Terry Shaw: May - August revised, balance at 8/31/2016 was \$3,211.93, income for May - August was \$215.00 (dues and raffle) and expenses totaled \$180.50 (wreath, rent, dues) for net income of \$34.50. YTD income was \$1,239.00 and YTD expenses were \$978.69 for YTD net income of \$260.31. Motion to approve by Glen Roosevelt, second by Charles Beal, motion carried. September - October, balance at 10/31/2016 was \$3,191.93, income for September - October was \$15.00 (raffle, misc.) and expenses totaled \$35.00 (rent, website) for net loss of \$20.00. YTD income was \$1,254.00 and YTD expenses were \$1,013.69 for YTD net income of \$240.31. Motion by to approve by Glen Roosevelt, second by Charles Beal, motion carried.

New Business:
