


#### **March 2019 SUVCW Department Encampment**

Over the past few months Charles received word that 3 of the new VA markers that he ordered have been installed. They are: John Lewis, Private in Co. E, 2nd Nebraska Cavalry, and Co. I, 43rd Missouri Infantry at Fairhaven (the VA only put the 2nd Nebraska Cavalry on the marker); and Daniel W. Bolles, Co. E, 51<sup>st</sup> Illinois Infantry at Westminster. He also ordered a flat granite VA marker for Civil War Veteran Michael Staunton buried in Winnemucca, Humboldt County, Nevada in an unmarked grave. Staunton was a Private in Company A, 1st California Infantry. Charles had General William Passmore Carlin, SUVCW Camp 25 blessing on researching and ordering the Staunton marker.


