March Camp Meeting

The Camp's March meeting, conducted via Zoom, was well attended, with 16 Brothers present.

Following the Commander's report, Treasurer, Steve Magoffin, reported that the Camp's treasury has a balance of \$10,5564.09. The Camp voted unanimously to spend \$20 for the Camp's share of the Department's costs to maintain our website for 2022, and 2023. Brother Steve reported that two Brothers, Albert Jones, and Steve Shampine, did not pay their dues, and the Camp voted to approve their discharge from the SUVCW.

Department Encampment

Camp 2 had a large delegation at the 137th Department Encampment, held in Bakersfield, on March 18th. Brothers Jamie Bellows, Phil Caines, Bill Gallagher, Steve Magoffin, Dean Smith, Brandon Villardi, Ken Walker, and Sister Melinie Caines, President of the Department Auxiliary, represented the Camp, and participated in the election of new Officers for the Department, as well as other business. Congratulations to CDR Smith who was re-elected as a member of the Department Council, and to Br. Ken Walker who was reappointed to the office of Department Guide.

Brother Kevin Tucker, a member of the National Committee on Administration, who was representing the Commander-in-Chief, Bruce Frail, to conduct the installation of the new Officers, gave some remarks about the launch of a new SUVCW website, and other initiatives. Then it got very Brother Tucker reported on interesting, as recommendations from the National Membership Committee, regarding a change in the wording of the qualifications for becoming a member of the SUVCW; and, he asked that the Department vote, up or down, as a way of informing the National Encampment, to be held in August, as to how the membership felt about the recommendations. The recommendation was to define "Male" as a person officially designated as "biologically male, at birth." Br. Bill Gallagher started the discussion, raising the

issue of financial liability for Camps, who have very limited funds, but are ultimately responsible for accepting an applicant. Others wanted more time to discuss the issue, and to take it back to their Camps, before they could vote. There seemed to be near consensus on not voting on the matter, at all, which set off a riotous discussion of the proper way to accomplish that, which led to more redundant discussion about the merits of, and problems with, the recommended definition. Ultimately, the matter was tabled, much to the dismay of Br. Tucker.

SUVCW Life Membership

Br. Tucker also mentioned that the fees for a Life Membership will probably be raised substantially at the National Encampment, in August. Camp 2 has four Life Members—Claiborne Cowgill, Theodore Ott, John Richardson, and Dean Smith. A perk of Life Membership is that National dues are waived, and the Department, and Camp 2, have also waived dues for Life Members.
