DEPARTMENT ORDER No. 2 Series 2001-2002

DEPARTMENT BUDGET

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the Department of California and Pacific, by the Department Bylaws, the National Constitution and Regulations, and National Policies, it is hereby ordered as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: The Fiscal Year, for purposes of this Department Budget, shall run continuously from July 1st of each year through June 30th of the following year.

<u>Section 2</u>: After consultation with appropriate Department officers and others, the below revenue and expenditure amounts are hereby adopted as the budget of the Department of California and Pacific for the FY 2001. It is intended that these figures be treated as guidelines for operational purposes of the Department:

FY 2001 BUDGET

Department of California and Pacific Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War

Department funds are authorized, as may be necessary and proper as indicated in TABLE 1 and TABLE 2, below, and as defined hereinafter under the authority and conditions provided for by the Department Bylaws and in any other lawful and applicable appropriations, as may be established for the Department of California and Pacific Fiscal Year (FY) 2001 Budget.

REVENUES

<u>Department Per Capita Taxes (\$1,005)</u>: Revenue from Department Per Capita Taxes at \$3 per Brother, per annum (75¢ per quarter), at three hundred thirty-five (335) Brothers, excluding Juniors.

<u>National Per Capita Taxes (\$4,020)</u>: Revenue from National Per Capita Taxes at \$12 per Brother, per annum (\$3 per quarter), at three hundred thirty-five (335) Brothers, excluding Juniors.

<u>Application Fees (\$50)</u>: Revenue from Application fees at \$5 per Brother, at ten (10) new Brothers during the Fiscal year.

National Web Fees (\$25): Revenue from fees collected by applicants applying via the national website at \$5 per Brother, at five (5) new Brothers during the Fiscal year.

<u>Interest (\$25)</u>: Revenue from Interest accumulated from any savings or other investment accounts held in trust for the Department.

Department Encampment (\$1,000): Revenue collected from Brothers and guests who plan on attending the 116th Department Encampemnt and luncheon, to be used specifically for expenses associated with the Encampment, including photographs and a PDC badget for the outgoing Department Commander. The amount is based on twenty-five dolars (\$25) per Brother, in anticipation of fourty (40) Brothers registering to attend.

<u>Encampment Fundraiser (\$300)</u>: Revenue from fundraising activities to subsidize the payment of expenses associated with the 116th Department Encampment.

Donations (\$0): Revenue from Donations made to the Department, from any sources whatsoever, be it fellow Brothers, Allied Orders, or otherwise.

<u>Other Income (\$0)</u>: Revenue from any other sources. **NO** "other income" is anticipated.

OUTLAYS

TAXES FUND (\$4,095)

<u>National Per Capita Taxes</u> – <u>T-01 (\$4,020)</u>: For purposes of remunerating per capita taxes to the National Treasurer as required by the SUVCW Constitution and Regulations. The amount shall be \$12 per Brother, per annum (\$3 per quarter), at three hundred thirty-five (335) Brothers, excluding Juniors.

<u>Application</u> – <u>T-02 (\$50)</u>: For purposes of forwarding the admission fee to the National Treasurer as required by Article VII of Chapter I of National Regulations. The amount shall be \$5 per new Brother, anticipating ten (10) new Brothers during the Fiscal Year.

<u>National Web Fees</u> – <u>T-03 (\$25)</u>: For purposes of forwarding fees collected by applicants applying via the national website at \$5 per Brother, at five (5) new Brothers during the Fiscal Year.

OPERATIONS FUND (\$1,972)

<u>Department Encampment</u> – <u>O-01 (\$700)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of holding the 116th Department Encampment (including the purchase of a PDC badge for the outgoing Department Commander) and luncheon (including photographs).

<u>Banking Fees</u> – <u>O-02 (\$150)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of opening and maintaining any savings, checking, or other investment accounts at an FDIC insured institution; and for other necessary purposes related to banking fees.

<u>Forms and Materials</u> – <u>O-03 (\$200)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of supplying necessary stationary, forms, and other materials for officers as authorized by Department Bylaws; and for other necessary purposes related to forms and materials.

Newsletter – <u>The California Column</u> – <u>O-04 (\$200)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of editing, publishing, printing, and mailing *The California Column* newsletter, including, but not limited to, supplies and equipment; and for other necessary purposes related to *The California Column* newsletter. Certain items necessary for the publication of the newsletter are itemized in TABLE 5, below. The budgeted amount listed above in TABLE 2 is in excess of that in TABLE 5, to account for the occasional need to print extra copies or due to errors in printing, like situations, or the need for additional publication materials.

<u>Post Office Box</u> – <u>O-04 (\$22)</u>: For purposes of half of the expenses incurred as a result of renting/leasing a post office box, to be used for Department business and shared with the Phil Sheridan Camp No. 4; and for other necessary purposes related to renting/leasing a post office box.

<u>Postage</u> – <u>O-05 (\$200)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of authorized Department mailings, exclusive of *The California Column* newsletter; and for other necessary purposes related to postage.

<u>Telephone Calls</u> – <u>O-06 (\$200)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of Department authorized long distance telephone calls; and for other necessary purposes related to long distance telephone calls.

<u>Duplicating</u> – <u>O-07 (\$100)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result photocopying and duplication costs; and for other necessary purposes related to duplication.

<u>Commander Travel Expenses</u> – <u>O-07 (\$200)</u>: At the 115th Department Encampment Delegates authorized the appropriation of not more than \$200 for purposes of expenses associated with official travel and other associated expenses of the Department Commander when traveling to Camps during the 2001-2002 term.

Bonding – **O-08 (\$0)**: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of providing surety bonding of the Department Secretary-Treasurer; and for other necessary purposes related to bonding. [During the FY 2001 no amount is budgetted for bonding because during the previous year approximately \$150 was already appropriated and the bond good for three years, as well as being transferrable. The current rate is approximately \$100 per year.]

AWARDS FUND (\$150)

<u>Department Awards/Recognition</u> – <u>A-01 (\$150)</u>: For purposes of expenses incurred as a result of demonstrating appreciation and providing awards on behalf of the Department; and for other necessary purposes related to Department Awards/Recognition.

GENERAL FUND (\$200)

<u>General Fund</u> – <u>G-01 (\$631)</u>: This fund is for purposes of general expenses not already categorized in this Budget.

RESERVE FUND (\$5,083)

<u>Reserve</u> – <u>R-01 (\$5,083)</u>: This contingency fund shall be used for emergency purposes of the Department, as determined by the Department Commander in conjunction with other officers of the Department.

PER CAPITA DUES FOR "JUNIORS"

ATTACK ON AMERICA

<u>Section 1</u>: Yesterday the United States was faced with a national tragedy. Two airplanes crashed into the World Trade Center, and a third into the Pentagon, in an apparent terrorist attack. Our first concern should be to check the welfare of our fellow Brothers and their families who may have been impacted by this catastrophic event, then to take every precaution to protect our family and friends from further attacks.

<u>Section 2</u>: In the strongest terms I condemn these heinous attacks on the United States. There is no justification for such a senseless assault against innocent civilians. This was not a spontaneous crime, but rather a very carefully planned and prepared plot to execute countless American citizens.

<u>Section 3</u>: Please join with Rosemary and me in offering our prayers and heartfelt condolences to the Brothers and other American citizens who have lost family and friends in this tragedy and for those in need. I also ask that you thank the national community of emergency workers fighting hard to rescue our fellow citizens.

<u>Section 4</u>: In honor of, and remembrance of these fellow citizens I am directing that all Camp Charters be draped in black for the next thirty (30) days. Furthermore, I request all Brothers who can, to fly the Flag of the United States of America at half-staff.
