<u>Section 1</u>: It is with a very heavy heart that we report that Brother Daniel Martin Bunnell, Past Department Commander passed away on Saturday, August 8, 2020 after a two year battle with cancer.

<u>Section 2</u>: Brother Bunnell was born March 9, 1955 in San Jose, California and developed a love of history very early in life.

<u>Section 3</u>: Brother Bunnell became a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War in 1991 and served 5 terms as the Commander of the Phil Sheridan Camp No. 4 in San Jose, California. He was instrumental in holding both Phil Sheridan Camp No. 4 and the Department of California and Pacific together during a difficult time in the mid-1990s. Brother Dan was the Commander of the Department of California and Pacific for two terms and also served on several National Committees and was National Chaplain for the 2014-2015 term. He was also a member of the Sons of Veterans Reserve.
