

> Camp Order No. 1--Series 2018 May 9, 2018 Passing of Camp 18 Brother Roger L. Rothrock, Major General, U.S. Army Ret.

By the authority vested in me as Commander of General George Stoneman, Camp 18 of the Department of California & Pacific, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, by the Department Bylaws, the National Constitution and Regulations, and National Policies, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: It is with a heavy heart that we report that Brother Roger L Rothrock, Major General, Ret., of Palm Springs, CA, a Life Member of General George Stoneman Jr., Camp 18, who was held in great regard, passed away on Saturday, May 5, 2018. Besides our organization, General Rothrock was a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason and a member in Good Standing with many other Organizations.

Section 2: His family has informed us that his remains will be shipped to Indiana for final internment and that it will be a private funeral and memorial service.

Section 3: Camp 18 extends sincere condolences to the entire Rothrock family. However, they have indicated that it is not necessary to send any sympathy cards. However, those wishing to do so, can send condolences to the Palm Springs Scottish Rite; P.O. Box 3996; Palm Desert, California, 92261-3996.

Section 4: The Camp Charter is to be draped in black for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.

Section 5: All Camp 18 Brothers are respectfully directed to attach a black mourning ribbon to their membership badge (pursuant to C&R, Article III, Sec. 9) for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.

## **Decoration Day Service 2018**



At our last camp meeting, Camp Historian Burt Hogue shared an interesting letter he had come across while doing some other research.

The following are Excerpts from a Letter from Major General George Stoneman to Thaddeus Lowe:

Washington DC July 10th 1863

Prof Lowe Washington D.C.

My dear Sir,

Before we part I beg leave to testify to you in writing as I often have in words, my appreciation of the valuable services you have rendered the Govt during

your connection with the Army of the Potomac in the use of your "portable Balloons" in the various operation of that Army.

I have been up in them often and never made an ascent without coming down much better informed in regard to everything in my vicinity than I could possibly have been by any other means.

I trust you will not be discouraged but will persevere in your laudable endeavors to serve the Govt and the cause, feeling assured that in the end you will be able to do away with the prejudices with which you have had to contend, and prove to the world the great utility of Balloons and Balloon Signals in the conduct of a war, and remain
