If you have any ambulatory issues, you are encouraged to reserve early and request a Ground Floor room as the two-story hotel does not have elevators. Room Rates are \$125/night, with Service Charges/Taxes to be added, and includes buffet breakfasts for two Guests per room for those wishing to share.

Registration and meal prices are still to be determined and will be announced as soon as we receive the information.


