
Patriotic Hall Inventory By Bob Lowe PDC

Bob Hope Patriotic Hall in Los Angeles has served as a meeting place and depository for veterans organizations since its construction in 1925. It is about to close its doors for a lengthy renovation. Since March 2006 and under the leadership of Camp 17's Commander, Glen Roosevelt, an inventory of GAR and Allied Orders related items has been taking place. It has been quite a task to separate the above articles from those of other veteran's organizations and house them in a single designated room. Most of the items have not seen the light of day for many decades. On July 14-15, 2006, Rosemary and I joined with others in work parties which unpacked, cleaned, sorted, inventoried and repacked the thousands of records, artifacts and items located in this historic building. We commend the dedication and diligence of Brother Roosevelt and others involved in this most important project. It was an honor and pleasure for us to be a small part of this effort.

MINUTES OF LAST MEETING, June 10, 2006

Present: Brothers Dave Allyn, Jack Bruzas, George Cavanagh, Bill Daley, John Finch, Tom Helmantoler, Bob Lowe, Jeff Malone, John May, Colin McKim, Deane Poole, Jerry Sayre, Mike Schooling, Dave Shaffer, Marc Stockwell-Moniz, Will Tisch, George Van Valkenburg and guests Gay Allyn, Julie Atzen, Brenda Boucher, Clari Cheng, Randy Crouch, Angie Daley, Pedro Garcia, Cindy Hodges, Rosemary Lowe, Linda McKim, Kim Sayre, Jan Shaffer, and Eileen Tisch. The meeting was called to order by Cmdr. Will Tisch at 4:40pm at the Staff NCO Club, Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, San Diego, California. The opening prayer was offered by Chaplain D. Poole and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by J. May. Cmdr. W. Tisch introduced special guest, author Pedro Garcia. A motion (Lowe/Daley) to approve the minutes of the last meeting as printed in the newsletter was approved. JVC D. Allyn reported new member Marc Stockwell-Moniz, whose ancestor served in the 35th MA. Infantry. A motion (Allyn/May) to approve this member's application was passed unanimously. Membership pin was presented by recruiter J. Sayre. ROTC Award was presented by W. Tisch to AFJROTC Cadet Senior Lt. Col. Clari Cheng from Mira Mesa High School. She was present accompanied by USAF MSGT. Randy Crouch. An additional award was presented to Cadet Senior Airman Omar Lopez from Vista High School, who was not present. Chaplain D. Poole reported that SCV Cmdr. Steve Smith was married at USMCAS Miramar. Congratulations from the Camp. Sec. J. May read a letter from Gov. Schwarzenegger's office offering the services of San Diego District Director Cameron Durckel to attend the flagpole dedication in place of the Governor. Also reported was a note from MOH recipient John Finn, who declined an invitation to hoist the first flag at the dedication due to prior commitments. Mr. Finn also sent a contribution of \$100 to the flagpole fund. Carmen LaBelle, owner of Coast Orignals, sent a letter accompanying her contribution of the ribbons used for the Mt. Hope Memorial Day event and a letter was received from the Southern Museum of Locomotive and Civil War History thanking the Camp for our recent donation. Treas. J. May reported that expenditures since the last meeting have been \$229.30 and income has been \$205.50. There is now a balance of \$3344.56, of which \$1994.50 is in our Flagpole Restoration Fund. W. Tisch reported on the Memorial Day Service at Mt. Hope Cemetery attended by a large group. J. Sayre reported on the service at the Pittenger gravesite that went well and was well-covered by the press. B. Lowe reported on an all-day presentation, by himself and Rosemary Lowe, at Greenfield Middle School in El Cajon that was very well received. B. Lowe also reported the Camp's participation at the El Cajon Elks' Memorial Day Service. T. Helmantoler reported on the Color Guard's appearance at the San Diego Surf Dawgs' baseball games. D. Allyn reported on BSA Eagle Scout presentations and urged all members to take a more active role in helping to make these presentations. Contact Br. S. Berrey to volunteer. Upcoming events include the Flagpole Dedication at Mt. Hope on July 3 and the Vista re-enactment on July 8 and 9. J. Sayre asked for volunteers to form an honor guard at the Flagpole Dedication and W. Tisch asked for help in manning a recruitment table at the re-enactment. Old Business items included an up-date on the Flagpole Dedication from J. May. The ceremony will be held at 10am and the public and press are invited. Representatives from the Governor's Office, Congresswoman Susan Davis and the Veterans' Administration will be present. The keynote speaker will be Professor Stuart McConnell, author of the G.A.R. study, Glorious Contentment. All are urged to attend. Placement of the boulder with dedicatory plaque will be at 9am on June 24. Help is needed by as many members as possible, as the boulder weighs about 3000 lb. J. Sayre presented an up-date on the Odd Fellows' Cemetery. It looks like the Camp will not take an ownership position in the site due to concerns by the National SUVCW of potential liability issues. W. Tisch noted that the recent publicity given our Camp is the result of the efforts of Scott Langhoff from the United Veterans' Council. New Business included 1) the next Camp meeting which will take place on Aug. 12, 2) a copy of Muriel Baron's book, Now I Take My Pen in Hand, was presented to the Camp from D. Poole and Brenda Boucher, 3) B. Lowe noted that the next meeting of the San Diego Civil War Roundtable featuring a presentation by the Civil War Preservation Trust will take place on July 19 at 7pm at the Presbyterian church in Allied Gardens, 4) a motion (Lowe/Daley) to spend up to \$600 from the Flagpole Restoration fund for fees and honorariums was passed, and 5) J. Sayre expressed his interest in designing a Camp ad for the National Encampment program. 'Members' Minutes' allowed each present to bring to the Camp's attention anything of general interest. T. Helmantoler reported that the program at the next meeting will be by Br. A. Brooks and mentioned that he would like to see other members present programs at our regular meetings. D. Shaffer reported that the granite boulder at his property has been shaped and is ready to affix the dedicatory plaque to. G. Van Valkenburg noted that a recent trip to Philadelphia reminded him that the terrain over which the Union soldiers marched was difficult to traverse. M. Moniz mentioned his desire to acquire a uniform and asked for suggestions. B. Lowe reiterated the qualifications of our speaker at the Flagpole Dedication as an expert in the study of the Grand Army of the Republic. J. May reported the death of family member, ADM. The Flagpole Dedication at GAR Hill ~ by Jerry Sayre PCC

On July 3rd 2006, 15 members of the Sgt. Wm. Pittenger Camp 21, 5 ladies from the ASUVCW, 1 DUV from Nancy Hanks Lincoln Tent 5, and 2 members of the Sedgwick-Granger Camp 17 gathered at GAR Hill, Mt Hope Cemetery in San Diego to dedicate a new Flagpole and Monument to the Grand Army of the Republic. A culmination of an 18-month project, the flagpole was to replace an older one damaged and removed in 2005. Funds were raised by Camp 21, including those from National Special Projects Fund, to purchase and have set, the 30' flagpole. The Monument was made from local granite and plaques and was placed by 5 members of Camp 21. The event was attended by members of the local Civil War Community, several local veterans' organizations, and a representative from Governor Schwarzenegger's office. Music was provided by American Civil War Brass Band, Soloist Rita Cartwright, Piper Kirk Yslas, and Co G, 6th US Reenactors fife and drum unit, Jim and Colin McKim. Company G, 5th CA, SVR and members of Co G, 6th US Reenactors, provided a color guard and musket squad. The first flag was raised amid cheers and singing of the "Star Spangled Banner" by Alex Kapitanski, locally known as "The Flag Man." Jul 4th 2006, was the 50th anniversary of the dedication of the G.A.R. Monument at Mt Hope Cemetery, placed by the WRC in 1956.


