Cemetery, to complete this endeavor, including a plaque and presentation stone to the memory of Captain Thomas Shelly, USA, the last, living Union Veteran in San Diego and a Grand Army of the Republic member. Sr. Vice Commander Tom Helmantoler is heading up this project. Minter's Ranch is the site near Lake Henshaw where the only Civil

War "engagement" took place in California and we are committed to placing a memorial there to commemorate this action. Brother Gene Armistead has studied this engagement and offered pertinent information as to the whereabouts and appropriate nature and interpretation of this monument. Brother Dave Shaffer, our Memorials Officer is heading this project. The School Essay contest offered exciting interaction at December's meeting and generated interest from our members as to the conditions of the contest. Ideas included subject

matter on the *Grand Army of the Republic* and the *Civil War* in general. Other ideas included offering the contest to advanced placement students in the eleventh and twelfth grade, fourth and fifth graders, or high school students in general. (Cont on Pg. 7)

## MINUTES OF LAST MEETING, December 9, 2006

Present: Brothers Dave Allvn, Gene Armistead, Brian Bingham, Bill Daley, Robert Dodge, John Finch, Bob Lowe, Jeff Malone, John May, Jerry Sayre, Mike Schooling, Dave Shaffer, Will Tisch, and guests Gay Allyn, Darlene Armistead, Julie Atzen, Angie Daley, Hilda Dodge, Cindy Hodges, Charmaine Malone, Mac and Helen Masso, Cheryl Reynolds, Kim Sayre, Jan Shaffer, Steve and Deanne Smith and Eileen Tisch. The meeting was called to order by Commander Will Tisch at 4:30pm at the Staff NCO club, Miramar MCAS, San Diego, California. J. Malone led the Pledge of Allegiance and the opening prayer was offered by B. Lowe. Cmdr. Steve Smith, Fr. A. J. Ryan Camp #302, SCV, and his wife Deanne were introduced as special guests. W. Tisch announced the death of Br. Lt. Col. Richard Locke and also reminded members of the passing earlier this year of Br. Charles Harber. A motion (Lowe/Daley) to approve the minutes of the last meeting as printed in the newsletter was passed. JVC D. Allyn reported one new member, John Howell, whos ancestor served in the 48th PA Volunteer Infantry. A motion (Allyn/Sayre) to approve his application was passed unanimously. W. Tisch distributed a membership application to all present with the intent that all try to recruit new members. The Al Hodges Memorial Brother of the Year Award was presented by Cmdr. Tisch and Cindy Hodges to J. Sayre. A presentation of a framed photo was also presented to Dave and Jan Shaffer for their efforts on behalf of the Flagpole Replacement Project. Secretary's correspondence included two letters of thanks from the Civil War Preservation Trust for the Camp's donation to their legal fund and to their effort to purchase land on the Fredericksburg battlefield. Also read was General Order 5 from the C-in-C thanking brothers for their participation in Remembrance Day activities. Treasurer J. May reported expenditures, since the last meeting of \$662.29 and income of \$330.50. There is now a total of \$2440.27 in the treasury, of which \$1325.45 remains in the Flagpole Replacement Fund. W. Tisch reported on the re-opening of the U.S. Grant Hotel in San Diego at which the Camp provided the color guard.

W. Tisch also reported on the Camp's participation at the Massing of the Colors in Balboa Park sponsored by the Boy Scouts of America and the Military Order of the World Wars. J. Sayre reported on the Veterans' Day Parade in San Diego, at which the Camp had a contingent of members as well as some of the Ladies' Auxiliary marching. J. Sayre also reported on the Mother Goose Parade in El Cajon where a vintage truck provided by D. Shaffer was used by the Camp. J. Sayre also mentioned the Fallbrook Christmas Parade where a small contingent of Camp members marched. D. Allyn reported on the Remembrance Day service at the Pittenger gravesite, the highlight of which was the recitation, by rote, of the Gettysburg Address by J. Sayre. It was noted that this is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Albert Woolson, last surviving Union Civil War veteran & GAR member, and of the celebration of Remembrance Day at Gettysburg, W. Tisch mentioned that the Camp, under the leadership of S. Berrey, is still awarding certificates to Eagle Scouts. Up-coming events include: 1) Veterans' Memorial Service, Dec. 23 at VMMC in Balboa Park, 2) Lincoln Pilgrimage, Feb. 10 in Redlands, and 3) Massing of the Colors, Feb. 18 at Forest Lawn in Hollywood Hills. The next Camp meeting will be on Feb. 10 at MCAS Miramar. G. Armistead gave a summary of his research on the Civil War at Minter's Ranch, near Lake Henshaw. On Nov. 29, 1861, the 1<sup>st</sup> California Cavalry captured the Showalter party, a group of Confederate sympathizers who were on their way to Texas to join the Southern cause. If the Camp is interested in erecting a memorial plague at the site, the best way is through the California Office of Historic Preservation. They will install and maintain an historical marker for approximately \$2900. The Vista Irrigation District owns the property, so they will also have to be included in the planning. A motion (Armistead/Schooling) was passed to form a committee that will undertake a study of the proposed historical marker and recommend a course of action. This committee will be chaired by D. Shaffer. Br. Armistead was thanked by the Camp for his efforts in getting this project started. In an effort to get the Camp more involved in San Diego County youth, W. Tisch suggested an essay contest. A motion (Lowe/ Sayre) was passed to form a committee to pursue this idea. J. Finch will chair this committee. Camp members should see him if interested in sering. Cmdr. Steve Smith of the Fr. A.J. Ryan Camp #302 of the SCV addressed the Camp and expressed his thanks for the help and support offered to him during his term of office. J. May mentioned the work of the Civil War Preservation Trust and expressed a hope that the Camp can continue to support this organization. B. Lowe reminded the Camp of our obligation to complete the Last Soldier Project. We do have permission to erect a memorial on GAR Hill at the Mt. Hope Cemetery in San Diego. A motion (Lowe/Armistead) was passed allowing the use of a portion of the money left in the Flagpole Replacement Fund to help in funding this project. New Business included; 1) a gift from the Camp to First Lady Eileen Tisch of a Civil War Santa figurine, 2) a motion (Lowe/Armistead) passed to use up to \$30 to buy donuts for breakfast at the Department Encampment, and 3) a motion (Lowe/Daley) passed to spend up to \$40 on an ad in the program at the Department Encampment. Election of Camp officers for 2007 commenced: first, a mtion (Sayre/Armistead) was passed to elect all unopposed candidates by acclamation. G. Armistead nominated W. Tisch for Commander, T. Helmantoler for Sr. Vice Commander, D. Allyn for Jr. Vice Commander, and J. May for Sec./Treas. For Camp Counsel, D. Allyn nominated J. Sayre, B. Lowe nominated D. Shaffer (declined), B. Lowe nominated B. Daley, and W. Tisch nominated B. Lowe. All were elected by acclamation. Dept. of California and Pacific SVC, Jerry Sayre

The implication is that the time lapse between 1865 and the present is enough to render the subject less personal to the reader. 
