

This Day In Civil War History

Saturday Nov. 26 1864 TERRIFIC TURKEYS TAKEN TOWARDS THANKSGIVING

Abraham Lincoln's original proclamation ordering a day of thanksgiving had been a somber document, full of religious references and imploring the people to give thanks to God for the blessings He had showered on America even in the midst of a bitter war. It did not take long at all for the usual American tendency to turn from the religious to the secular to assert itself. A soldier near Gen. Sherman's headquarters at Oconee River, Ga., wrote in his diary that "Thanksgiving Day was very generally observed in the army, the troops scorning chickens in the plenitude of turkeys with which they had supplied themselves...The soldiers gave thanks and were merry as only soldiers can be...Many obtain a delicious sirup made from sorghum, which is cultivated on all the plantations. There was nothing heard of 'hard tack'"

President Lincoln's Thanksgiving Proclamation

In the middle of the American Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln, prompted by a series of editorials written by Sarah Josepha Hale, proclaimed a national Thanksgiving Day, to be celebrated on the final Thursday in November 1863:

"The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequalled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to foreign States to invite and to provoke their aggression, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere except in the theatre of military conflict; while that theatre has been greatly contracted by the advancing armies and navies of the Union. Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defence, have not arrested the plough, the shuttle, or the ship; the axe had enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battle-field; and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years, with large increase of freedom. No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy.

It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and voice by the whole American people. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens. And I recommend to them that while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the city of Washington, this third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the independence of the United States the eighty-eighth."

Proclamation of President Abraham Lincoln, October 3, 1863.

Since 1863, Thanksgiving has been observed annually in the United States.

Report of Our Last Union Civil War Soldier Ceremony - Tom Helmantoler

On November 14, Camp 21 celebrated the culmination of a long project by honoring our San Diego County with the dedication of the monument to San Diego's last Union soldier, GAR Comrade Thomas Chapman Shelly, who died in 1943, just shy of his 100th birthday. After the opening ceremonies, the GAR/SUVCW ritual of celebrating the Last Soldier was used, beginning with prayer by Chaplain Deane Poole and the reading of the words of the sacrifice of Union soldiers by SVC Jeff Malone. It continued with keynote speaker, Mrs. Barbara Mondt, Past President of Nancy Hanks Lincoln Tent No. 10 DUVCW, with her fine description of the life of Thomas C. Shelly and his military career, which extended into the Indian Wars period after the Civil War. Regretfully, we were unable to secure descendants of Comrade Shelly to attend the ceremony.

This was followed by short comments by Commander Tom Helmantoler on Remembrance Day, of which the ceremony for same was combined with the Last Soldier Ceremony. The dedication of the flowers, musket volley and benediction closed a fine and fitting ceremony. It was attended by about 40 people and included Robin and Roy Adair of the UDC and SCV respectively, Sue Zimmer, President of Nancy Hanks Tent, Kay Hildenbrand, President of the new DUVCW Mary Jane Stafford Tent in Temecula, Dave Tooley, President of the SDCWRT, and David Lugo, Director of Mt. Hope Cemetery. Thanks to everyone who attended and special thanks to the organizing Committee and Mr. Lugo, who went "above and beyond" to facilitate this event for Camp 21. It is greatly appreciated by all of the brothers of Camp 21.











