Peck, longtime Abraham Lincoln Presenter who departed on 3 Nov, 2015, having fought a good fight and having kept the Faith. Bill enjoyed portraying the Nation's 16th President and was a fun-loving, caring and kind man who loved children most. Here is a post from The Huntington Beach Civil War Days Facebook page:

It is with somber hearts that we inform everyone that Bill Peck passed away peacefully today at 12:45am. Please join us in thoughts and prayers for his family, friends and loved ones. He was a passionate historian and educator who touched thousands with his charisma and knowledge. We are extremely grateful to have had him as our President Lincoln presenter for over twenty years. He will be greatly missed by all. The most fitting words that come to mind for this solemn occasion come from the mouth of President Lincoln himself when he left Illinois as President-Elect in February of 1861:

"My friends, no one, not in my situation, can appreciate my

feeling of sadness at this parting. To this place and the kindness of these people, I owe everything. Here I have lived a quarter of a century, and have passed from a young to an old man. Here my children have been born, and one is buried. I now leave, not knowing when, or whether ever, I may return, with a task before me greater than that which rested upon Washington. Without the assistance of that Divine Being who ever attended him, I cannot succeed. With that assistance I cannot fail. Trusting in Him who can go with me, and remain with you, and be everywhere for good, let us confidently hope that all will yet be well. To His care commending you, as I hope in your prayers you will commend me, I bid you an affectionate farewell." (more on Pg. 7)

In Memoriam, Rest In Peace Bro. William T. (Bill) Peck

The following are items of interest on the life of William T. Peck, our departed Brother.

"Mr. Peck has been presenting Abraham Lincoln since 1981. A Living Historian, he is also a member of the Screen Actors Guild, a Lifetime member of the Abraham Lincoln Presenters and a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. In his travels he has presented Lincoln for the Siemens Corporation in Philadelphia, the American International Toy Fair in New York City, the California State Fair in Sacramento, California, the Business Objects Company of Chicago, as well as many others, and has made appearances in many of our states, particularly in his native state of Illinois, and most recently in Arizona. Mr. Peck is an instructional expert for the GATE program in the San Diego Unified School District, San Diego, California. He touches on the content standards for Social Studies, particularly for Grade 8. He visits many schools during the year as well as Civil War Reenactments, libraries, Senior Centers, civic organizations, churches and is available year round. He retired from the San Diego, California Superior Court as a Judges Courtroom clerk in 1997 and now Abraham Lincoln is his passion. Mr. Peck is one of the finest Lincoln presenters in the nation. He has made numerous appearances for the Forest Lawn Memorial Parks Education Programs for school students. You may also find Mr. Peck on the History Channel where he has portrayed Lincoln several times with the most recent being "The Hunt for John Wilkes Booth," which first appeared on December 23, 2007. He has been in numerous video and screen productions through recent years." (from his webpage)

"'HUNTINGTON BEACH – Mr. Lincoln will hang his hat on Saturday after 21 years of speaking at the Huntington Beach Civil War Days re-enactment at Huntington Beach Central Park. Bill Peck, 84, has impersonated Abraham Lincoln for more than 30 years. He's known for annual performances at the local Civil War re-enactment, and frequent appearances at the Nixon Presidential Library & Museum and at schools and special events around Southern California. He's retiring Saturday because he is fighting Lou Gehrig's disease. "He's really a leader in our re-enactment community," said Darrell Rivers, the grandson of Maureen Rivers, a co-founder of Huntington Beach Civil War Days. "He's been an integral part in making the event what it is today." Peck will be brought out to the park in a wheelchair and plans to recite the Gettysburg Address as Lincoln for the last time from a bar stool. He'll be honored by about 800 re-enactors who will muster dressed as opposing Civil War soldiers at a retirement ceremony at 2:30 p.m. "I have enjoyed Huntington Beach more than any speaking engagements anywhere," Peck said.""
