## **COMMANDER'S REPORT:**

On Memorial Day, May 25, 2015, General Alfred Pleasonton Camp No. 24 and Friends of Civil War Alcatraz marched together, wearing Civil War uniforms and 1860's period costumers, in the Grand March from the Presidio Officer's Club to San Francisco National Cemetery at the Presidio in San Francisco, CA. Several camp members, including Brad Schall, Steve Johnson, Kenneth Felton and Don Wilt (Camp No. 22) attended this event. The day was cool and windy. A Memorial Day Ceremony was held at San Francisco National Cemetery at the Presidio just after the parade. The announcer at the ceremony introduced our group as the General Alfred Pleasonton Camp No. 24 of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. The ceremony was well attended by the general public and everyone seemed to enjoy the day. Our group was introduced as "General Alfred Pleasonton Camp No. 24 of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War" by the announcer, upon our entrance at the site of the ceremony.

After the ceremony, camp members and members of Friends of Civil War Alcatraz, went to the grave sites of notable Civil War veterans to give talks about each Civil War veteran. These Civil War veterans included: Lt. Colonel Joseph Stewart (First Commander of Alcatraz); Pauline Cushman (Union Spy); Major General Irvin McDowell; Major General Edward Baker (Senator from Oregon and a close personal friend of Abraham Lincoln); and 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant William Rufus Shafter (awarded a "Medal of Honor", based upon his service at Fair Oaks, VA). Those attending this event, spent the rest of the afternoon at a picnic on the plaza near the Presidio Officer's Club. Everyone had plenty of chicken and other dishes of good food to eat, along with a variety of great cookies for desert.

I attended the Civil War event at "Roaring Camp" in Felton, California on the Saturday, just prior to Memorial Day this year. I assisted members of Phil Sheridan Camp No. 4 and Abraham Lincoln Camp No. 10 of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War at this Civil War living history event with their displays, regarding: the Civil War; the Grand Army of the Republic; and the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. This event was attended by a large group of tourists from China. They really enjoyed seeing the Civil War re-enactment battles and all of the Civil War related displays at "Roaring Camp".

On June 2, 2015, Brothers Charles Kenyon and Kenneth Felton visited Mountain View Cemetery in Oakland, California, looking for grave sites of Civil War veterans. They visited the grave sites of veterans: James Patrick McElroy, Sgt. in Co. H of 9<sup>th</sup> Vermont Infantry; James Rockwell, Private in Co. A of 16<sup>th</sup> Iowa Infantry; and Alfred B. Clark, Private in Co. M of 1<sup>st</sup> Minnesota Heavy Artillery. The veteran grave sites of James Patrick McElroy and James Rockwell will be added to the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War National Graves Database and the listing in this database for Alfred B. Clark is being updated. Another trip will be made soon to

Mountain View Cemetery to continue looking for the burial sites of Civil War veterans: John Delos Presher, a Private in Co. G of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Wisconsin Infantry; and Thomas Phillip Canham, Bugler in Co. F of the 2<sup>nd</sup> California Cavalry. Brother Charles Kenyon plans to contact the Veterans Administration regarding the unit markings on the headstone for James Patrick McElroy, (listing his unit as being: Co. R of the 19<sup>th</sup> Vermont Infantry). His original military headstone, which was made and shipped to Mountain View Cemetery shortly after his death on August 8, 1900, listed him serving in Co. H of the 9<sup>th</sup> Vermont Infantry. The marking listing Co. H of the 9<sup>th</sup> Vermont Infantry, is the correct listing for all or nearly all of this veteran's service. The listing of Co. R of the 19<sup>th</sup> Vermont Infantry is either for this Civil War veteran's unit, where he served only briefly, or else it is an error.
