>>BATTLE OF DOMINGUEZ HILLS, AKA "THE BATTLE OF THE OLD WOMAN'S GUN"--<u>THIS SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7</u>, 10:00 AM TO 4:00 PM--FREE ADMISSION

Attached is a flier for a very fun reenactment of a battle for Los Angeles, fought in the war between the United States and Mexico, on October 8 & 9, 1846. Come and learn how 50 Californio militia killed 14 U.S. Marines, with the "Old Woman's gun," and caused the remainder of the Marines to retreat to their ship. You can also tour the Dominguez Adobe Museum, with its original furnishings, and a history of the Dominguez family, as well as a most fascinating display about an airshow held in 1910, attended by thousands of Angelenos.
