Following the meeting we will participate in the Auxiliary's annual Remembrance Day observance, featuring President Lincoln giving his Gettysburg Address. It is hoped that all Brothers will make an effort to attend.



September Camp 2 Meeting

Our Camp meeting, on September 14th, was held in-person at the American Legion Post 46, in Culver City, and attended by 15 Brothers, with 4 Brothers attending via Zoom. Sister Melinie Caines, representing our Auxiliary also attended.

Our JVC, Brandon Villardi, presented applications from Andreas Koch, John Ferris,

and Bruce Wearda, and all three were voted into the Camp. *HUZZAH!*

Br. John Richardson, the Camp's Historian, asked if any Brothers had documents, or Camp property, that should be either given to him, or recorded in the Camp's Property Inventory. Br. Phil Caines said that he has the Camp's Drum, Ballot Box, and that he will bring them to the Drum Barracks for our November meeting.

The Camp voted to donate \$50 to the Auxiliary to help pay for the President Lincoln reenactor.

Br. Bill Harrington gave an excellent presentation on his work at Angelus-Rosedale Cemetery, locating the Union Veterans buried in the Stanton Post's GAR Plot, as well as in the Rosecrans Camp's Plot. He also proposed a project to clean the headstones, reset those that have fallen over, replace those that are broken, and acquire them for graves where they are missing. In addition, there was a discussion of holding a Memorial Day ceremony there in 2025, as it will be the 160th anniversary of the end of the Civil War in 1865. Finally, it was noted that Br. Don Lynch has spent years compiling a list of ALL of the Union Veterans who are buried in the cemetery. HUZZAH!



The Brothers talked to many of the visitors, and participants, about the Civil War, the GAR, and their Union ancestors.

On Saturday, October 19th, Cdr. Smith, and Brothers Bill Harrington, Steve Magoffin, Jim Lybolt, Lowell Harris, Kris Anderson, and Bruce Wearda, visited Fort Tejon, where they were given an outstanding 2 ½ hour tour of the entire site. The Park Interpreter, Michael Deagon, talked about the history of the area, the 11 Native American tribes that lived in the area. the life of the Dragoons stationed there, their uniforms, and weapons, as well as their participation in the Civil War. Several of the Brothers helped raise the very large U.S. Flag, and Brothers Lybolt, and Harris, volunteered to fire the mountain howitzer, while our own artillery expert, Kris Anderson, chose to quietly critique the demonstration. A good time was had by all, and hopefully there will be another visit for Brothers unable to attend this one.
